

An important announcement

Club members and friends will be sad to learn that Felicity Good has given notice to stand down from her role as Chair, which she has held for the past 12 years. During that time the Club has hosted a wide variety of artists, selected by the Artistic Directors, for 70 wonderful concerts. She says "it was a great pleasure and privilege to welcome approximately 265 artists on their arrival to rehearse at the different venues prior to those concerts. They all had their own personalities but were mostly charming and some were even a bit nervous." One young pianist asked for a hug before she began her recital which Felicity was happy to dispense! Some others had arrived without music stands and being unable to access the Town Band's equipment in the Bunyan basement, she obtained a couple just as the music shop was closing. Freshly delivered local pizza ensured the Clare College Choir sang their hearts out on two occasions.

Felicity oversaw the Appeal to members in 2011 when the finances were looking bleak and she was heavily involved in the transfer of the 'Bedford Piano' in 2012 to the newly formed Bedford Piano Trust, comprising the Bedford Orchestral Society and the Bedfordshire Festival of Music, Speech & Drama.

She extends warm thanks to the Committee and members for their invaluable support and help during her tenure.

Dorothy Williams is also stepping back from the Committee after many years of valuable contribution, notably as our chief point of expertise in music education and contact for amateur music-making in Bedford: long may that tradition continue! We are enormously grateful to her too.

The Committee has co-opted a new member, Dr Ian Rowlands, to take on the role of Chairman. Ian has recently retired from a career in the university sector, where he taught information science and librarianship before moving into more senior administrative roles in research management.

"Felicity guided the Club through some very difficult financial waters and it's absolutely to her credit that we are still in existence, let alone solvent. The Committee will miss her enormously - although I'm very pleased that she has agreed to mentor me through the handover. If I can achieve half of what Felicity has, I will be very happy" says Ian.



Arriaga String Quartet - 21 January 1971


Christopher Wilson (piano) - 23 March 1972

Stile Antico: The Journey of the Mayflower

Stile Antico were to have performed with us this October, but that sadly has not come to pass. However, they have made an intensely moving film about the journey of the Mayflower which is available to watch online.





Here is their press release:

"One small candle may light a thousand..."

So wrote William Bradford, a Pilgrim on board the Mayflower. In September 1620, the small band of religious puritans sailed to what would become New England, seeking a life free from persecution. They were confident that God's favour was with them, but their journey was beset with difficulties, and their arrival heralded an era of destruction for the native Wampanoag tribe.

Award winning vocal ensemble Stile Antico seeks to shine a light on the unheard voices of the Mayflower story. Using a script written for the group by dramatist Katharine Armitage, the hour-long performance breathes life into the Pilgrims and the Mayflower crew. The drama is woven around extracts from 'Of Plimouth Plantation', the diary of William Bradford, the colony's first governor, who documented their extraordinary journey.

Interspersed with the spoken text are full-length performances of some of the finest vocal music of the time. Musical gems by William Byrd, Orlando Gibbons, Thomas Tomkins and others, bring this extraordinary story to life with passion and immediacy.

Gramophone Award

This year's Gramophone Awards featured a special **Beethoven 250 Award** that went to the pianist Martin Helmchen, Deutsches Symphonie-Orchester Berlin and Andrew Manze for their recording of Beethoven's Piano Concertos Nos 2 and 5 on Alpha. Martin Helmchen accepted the Award in a speech, saying 'recording something like this only makes sense in mutual spirit of curiosity, being willing to find these pieces as if they were new to us

and discover the hidden mysteries that are still there, and that was exactly the spirit that made this whole project so inspiring and so exciting. It was a pure joy [...] It is a privilege and I'm very grateful to be part of it.'

Martin played for us in February 2009 and Andrew Manze is of course well known to all of us as our President.
